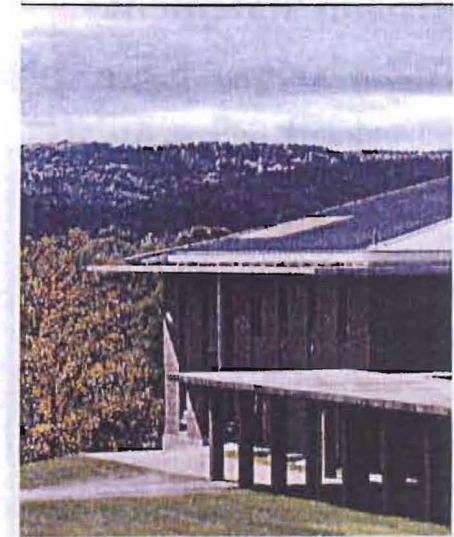

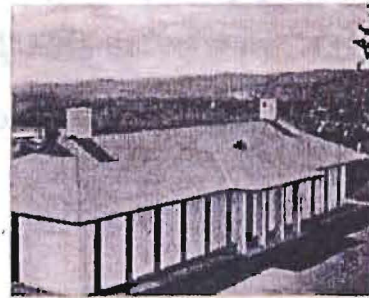


Mission Statement

The Landmark holdings are comprised of a variety of print, audio and photographic holdings initially collected by the College's founding librarian, Robert H. Rhodes and continued by succeeding members of the library staff. The Archives does not act as a repository for all recorded informa-

tion of the College and the scope of the collection is limited to information concerning the founding of the College, publications (both print and audiovisual), photographs, clippings and information documenting the pedagogy of teaching students with learning disabilities and AD/HD as mirrored in the College curriculum.

Windham Special Collection

As part of its holdings, the Archives is privileged to hold a limited amount of materials from Windham College which built and occupied this site until its closing in 1978. Special Collection materials include: brochures, catalogs, yearbooks, scrapbooks and issues of the college newspapers, *The Lion's Roar* and *Windham Free Press*.
